FEMA and other federal agencies continue to work to better prepare the Nation for natural disasters such as Hurricane Florence. FEMA's [Ready.gov website](#) is a useful resource which might be of value to your business or your customers. FEMA reminds the public that [flood insurance](#) is the best way for homeowners and business owners to be able to recover from flooding such as what is predicted with Florence. As you are aware, homeowners insurance policies generally do not cover flood insurance and the risk of flooding exists even outside of the mapped Special Flood Hazard Area.

### FEMA Updates

As a [reminder](#), the renewal of the Standard Flood Hazard Determination Form is in progress. While we do not expect any changes to be made to the current version of the form, we will monitor FEMA announcements in the coming weeks. In the past, FEMA has communicated information about renewals and any applicable extensions on its [webpage](#) on the form.

At CoreLogic, we continue to respond to FEMA's [announcement](#) on the Coastal Barrier Resources System maps and data. Internally, we are preparing for necessary changes to transition over to use of the data directly from U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS). At the same time, we continue to work with FEMA, the USFWS, and other affected stakeholders on the impact of the change.

FEMA [announced](#) the next public meeting of the Technical Mapping Advisory Council (TMAC) to be held in Reston, Virginia on September 25-26. As a reminder, Congress re-established [TMAC](#) as part of BW 12 to make recommendations to FEMA on its flood mapping program. At this meeting the public can provide comment to TMAC regarding its work.
