## Current Version of SFHDF Remains Valid

As we reported in a prior [Industry Alert](#), FEMA is considering changes to the Standard Flood Hazard Determination Form (SFHDF). While the current version of the form contains an expiration date of "December 31, 2011," FEMA has posted a statement on their website affirming the continued validity of the current version until a new form is approved:

"The current Standard Flood Hazard Determination Form (SFHDF) (expiration date, December 31, 2011) remains valid until a new SFHDF has been approved. Please periodically check the following websites for updates to the form: <http://www.fema.gov/library/viewRecord.do?id=1394> and [http://www.fema.gov/plan/prevent/fhm/frm\\_form.shtm](http://www.fema.gov/plan/prevent/fhm/frm_form.shtm)."

As a reminder, the expiration date that appears on the SFHDF does not apply to or impact the flood determination information recorded/documentated on a completed SFHDF for a given property.
